DAY 1 – Tuesday, 19 February 2013

The 57th Annual National Council Meeting (ANCM) was held on 19-22 February 2013 at the Philippine Scouting Center-Asia-Pacific Region (PSC-APR), Mt. Makiling, Los Banos, Laguna.

Delegates and observers started to arrive on 19 February 2013 and were billeted at the BP Hotel in Mt. Makiling Camp and other nearby hotels in the Municipality of Los Banos, Laguna. Registration started on 19 February 2013 until the morning of 20 February 2013.

DAY 2 – Thursday, 20 February 2013 Officer of the Day: RSD Bienvenido B. Toledo

All the delegates/participants, guests and staff assembled at the Vargas Hall at 1300H.

At 1330H, Officer of the Day, Mr. Bienvenido B. Toledo, Regional Scout Director, Visayas Region, BSP, called on Mr. Rogelio S. Villa, Jr., Director, Field Operations Division, BSP, for the recognition, presentation of delegates and the orientation.

ORIENTATION, RECOGNITION AND PRESENTATION OF DELEGATES

The following important matters were discussed by Dir. Villa for the delegates to be well informed on the duration of the conference, to wit:

- 1. Participation - Delegates are expected to attend all sessions and actively participate in all discussions. Wearing of conference ID at all times.
- 2. Be Punctual - Time schedule: Morning session will start at 0800H and ends at 1200H. Afternoon session: 1330H onwards
- Attire Delegates must strictly follow the required attire as listed in the schedule. The officer of 3. the day will announce if there are some changes in succeeding sessions/days.
- Smoking is not allowed inside the session hall. Everyone is requested to keep the conference 4. premises clean.
- 5. Meals will be served on the following schedule:
 - Lunch 1200H 1300H
 - Dinner 1800H, Vargas Hall, tonight's dinner will be sponsored by the Province of Laguna
 - AM & PM snacks- at the session hall
- Cell phones as much as possible must always be on a silent mode. 6.
- 7. At 1530H today, the election of four (4) regular members will take place.

- 8. On 21 February 2013, we will have the Tribute to Scoutmasters, Outstanding Commissioners, Council and Regional Chairmen at 10:30AM, Type A Uniform. Awardees are advised to report at least 30 minutes before the ceremony for briefing on program movements. Similarly, in the conduct of the National Court of Honor which will take place at 1:30PM tomorrow. Starting today, awardees must confirm their attendance to our NCH staff/booth not later than 10AM tomorrow, because we will be reading the certificates based on those who confirm so that we will not be wasting time reading the awardees as listed in the program if they are not around. On this ceremony, we must observe proper protocol to preserve the integrity and solemnity of the occasion.
- 9. A brotherhood dinner will take place tomorrow at the same time awarding and recognition of outstanding performance of local council in the areas of management, advancement, training, program, Scout shop sales, etc.
- 10. Mobilization of delegates: those who are staying outside of Mt. Makiling Camp, shuttle service shall be provided by the conference.
- Closing Ceremonies shall take place at 10:00AM on 22 February:, attire-Safari uniform. 11. Immediately after the closing ceremonies, the National Peace Jamboree opening ceremonies will start at 11AM at the Grand Arena.
- 12. The Scout Oath and Law is the minimum code of conduct in this conference.

Right after the orientation, Dir. Villa recognized all the delegates and requested them to register as the election of the four (4) regular members to the NEB will take place on the 1st Plenary Session. He informed the conferees that their names will be posted in the designated precincts in the conference venue.

The arrival of the Honorable Jejomar C. Binay, Vice-President, Republic of the Philippines and President of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.

OPENING CEREMONIES

The opening ceremonies started at exactly 1400H, Mr. J. Rizal C. Pangilinan, Secretary General, BSP, acted as the Master of Ceremonies. The program started with the Entry of the Officials of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines and the Guest of Honor and Speaker.

SG Pangilinan, Master of Ceremonies, requested the conferees to stand up for the Entry of Colors.

The Entry of Colors were composed by Senior Scouts from Laguna Council, BSP. The Invocation was led by Fr. Alfonso L. Grageda of Camarines Sur Council, BSP. Panunumpa nf Katapatan sa Watawat ng Pilipinas was led by Scout John Ernest Mari G. Cruz, RSR of Luzon. The Panunumpa at Batas ng Scout was led by Scout Josmond Jude C. Gorecho, RSR of Visayas, while the BSP Vision and Mission was led by Scout Renz John Michael G. Mendoza, RSR of Mindanao.

Right after the usual ceremonies, Mayor Del R. de Guzman, Vice-President for Luzon, BSP and the Vice-Chairman, 57th ANCM, delivered the Opening Remarks. (full text of the message was made part of this proceedings.)

As the opening message ended, SG Pangilinan informed the conferees that Honorable Jeorge E.R. Ejercito Estrada, Provincial Governor of the Province of Laguna will come a bit late.

He then introduced the Honorable Vice-President of the Republic of the Philippines, Jejomar C. Binay, President of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines to formally open the 57th ANCM and for the Keynote Address.

Vice-President Jejomar C. Binay took time to recognize all those present in the conference and delivered his keynote message which inspired and boosted the morale of all the delegates. Then he declared the 57th Annual National Council Meeting open. *The full text of his message is made part of the proceedings.*

At this juncture, SG Pangilinan announced that the election of four (4) regular members to the National Executive Board will take place during the first plenary session.

A well-organized and orderly photo session with the Vice-President followed. Thereafter, Vice- President Binay administered the oath of office for the newly elected Regional Chairmen.

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL TREASURER MR. ENRIQUE B. LAGDAMEO

57th ANNUAL NATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING Mt. Makiling, Los Banos, Laguna 19-22 February 2013

To our dynamic President, Hon. Jejomar C. Binay, to the distinguished officers and members of the National Executive Board, to the equally respectable officers and members of the Local Council Boards, Ladies and Gentlemen of the National Council, good morning!

Kahlil Gibran, a Lebanese-American artist, poet and writer once said: "To understand the heart and mind of a person, look not at what he has already achieved, but what he aspires to."

It is without question that the National Council has achieved so much, what we are after is the desire to achieve more: Maybe, just maybe, we should aspire for perfection. But of course, logic dictates that to achieve perfection, we must calculate the risk inherent in every endeavor.

As you may have noticed, the annual BSP financial statements are not included in the BSP's Annual Report which you are now holding. The Finance Committee with the concurrence of the National Executive Board decided to dispense with this year's reporting of the financial condition and performance of the BSP.

Don't fret. Relax and stay easy my friends.

The Commission on Audit or COA, put on hold the release of the audited version of the financial report for further review. We are all aware that this edition of our annual assembly is being held three months earlier than usual. It has been agreed that we conduct the council meeting earlier because many of our members will join the 2013 elections. Plus the fact that key government agencies such as the DepEd and the DILG, which many of you here belong to, will take a crucial role in ensuring the success of the upcoming mid-term elections.

The COA, which, as mandated by law, took over just recently the auditing task from our external auditor, the SGV and Company, and it could not release the results of the audit within a limited period of time, thus the delay.

However, rest assured that we shall furnish you with copies of the audited financial statements as soon as the COA releases the result of their audit. The COA also has informed us that the audited BSP financial statements would be published in the official website of the Commission, which is the www.coa.gov.ph.

We shall expect that there will be massive adjustments in our financial reporting once the COA releases its audit report. Let us bear in mind that the government accounting system uses a different type of chart of accounts compared to a private company which we used to practice.

I know that there maybe some questions lingering on your mind.

Let me answer some:

The Boy Scouts of the Philippines is in a transition period. We are now a certified Government Controlled Corporation as ruled by the Supreme Court. The decision of the Supreme Court under G.R. No. 177131 was promulgated on June 7, 2011 and made final and executor on March 14, 2012.

As such, we are obliged to follow certain government laws, rules and regulations that are required from a government office or corporation which include being subjected to the scrutiny of COA. Please be reminded that pursuant to Section 2 (1), Article IX-D of the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines, the Commission on Audit shall have the power, authority and duty to examine, audit and settle all accounts pertaining to the revenue and receipts of, and expenditures or uses of funds and property, owned or held in trust by, or pertaining to, the Government, or any of its subdivisions, agencies, or instrumentalities including government-owned or controlled corporations with original charters:

This means that: All government bodies should undergo COA auditing. Hence, the BSP is under the COA audit jurisdiction in the manner consistent with the provisions of the BSP charter.

At present, our system of operations is adapting to the government system with the help of the Commission on Audit. Our staff from the National Office and Regional Offices will soon undergo seminars and training to familiarize them with the new system. The National Office meanwhile, has stated to comply with the requirements of the Governance Commission on Government-Owned and Controlled Corporations (GCC) which is tasked to regulate the operations of all GOCCs, including the BSP. Similarly, we are in the process of integrating our personnel system to the Civil Service Commission.

Indeed, a huge task is ahead of us, but with our concerted efforts, we shall soon be enjoying the benefits of a more organized system of operations. Have faith in Kahlil Gibran.

Any more questions about this may be discussed later in the open forum segment of this plenary session. I can request the assistance of our legal luminaries of the National Executive Board headed by our President and Senior Vice President who are lawyers by profession.

57th ANNUAL NATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING Mt. Makiling, Los Banos, Laguna 19-22 February 2013

Greetings of Peace and Prosperity to one and all!

As provided in our charter, we are pleased to present to you our humble accomplishments for the year 2012.

How far have we gone with our Vision 2013 which is the measuring year for our triennial plan. . .

2013 is indeed our time to reflect and ponder on things that have made us a strong Boy Scouts of the Philippines.

Up to what extent was our achievement from that plan as we look towards 2016. . .

Last year, the Scouting world took notice of BSP's presence in various field of Scouting endeavor. BSP Secretary General J. Rizal C. Pangilinan was appointed to the position of Secretary General of ASEAN Scouts Association for Regional Cooperation. Our very own hardworking Senior Vice President Atty. Wendel E. Avisado got elected as member of the APR Scout Committee while many more were chosen to lend their expertise in various sub-committees.

We must also be proud that one of our Scouts won the Search for APR Outstanding Boy Scouts. It is worthwhile to note that the search was patterned after our very own Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts search. After hosting several activities of international status, BSP also joined a number of global events, a proof of the vibrancy of BSP from local to international level.

We did a lot in 2012 and let me now call our Secretary General, Mr. J. Rizal C. Pangilinan, to continue my report on the Administrative and Operational aspect of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.

ON MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

Scout membership significantly grew by 14.09% or an increase of 234,084 Scouts compared to the 1,661,456 Scouts registered in 2011. The Scout membership for 2012 represents 76.59% accomplishment against the membership goal of 2,475,050 Scouts and 21.50% achievement versus the membership potential of 8,818,162 Scouts.

A total of 1,895,540 Scouts registered in 2012 from ten (10) Scouting regions. Boy Scouting continues to lead the five sectional groups, which account for 40.81% of the total Scout membership or equivalent to 773,658 Scouts. KAB Scouts ranked second with 679,108 (35.83%), Senior Scouts – 356,084 (18.79%), KID Scouts – 66,828 (3.53%) and Rover Scouts – 19,862 (1.05%).

Training Courses for Junior Leaders

For the year 2012, a total of 3,728 Junior Leaders attended the Patrol Leaders Training Course in the Boy Scouts Section in the Local Councils of Batangas, Cagayan de Oro, Cotabato, Davao City, Nueva Vizcaya, Paranague City and Zamboanga-Sibugay.

Participants to Crew Leaders Training Course for Senior Scouting had a modest increase of 648 Senior Scouts from 2011 to 2012. A total of 1,831 Senior Scouts have completed the Crew Leaders Training Course in 2012 as compared to 2011 with only 1,183 Senior Scouts.

The National Scout Youth Forum

With the theme "Be Prepared: Leadership for Life" 78 Senior Scout Representatives answered the call for Leadership where 78 young people convened for the 2012 BSP National Scout Youth Forum for Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.

The Forum discussed on Youth Involvement and Empowerment; Strengthening Community-Based Scouting; the UN Millennium Development Goals; Mitigating the Impact of Climate Change; Solid Waste Management and Renewable Energy; Gender Equality and Neutrality; Localizing the Messengers of Peace Initiative; Scouting's Response to Emergency and Disaster Risk Reduction and Scouting for Differentlyabled Young People and Children in Difficult Circumstances.

- We released the latest Approved Merit Badges for our Scouts to enjoy and learn more as they progress in Scouting.
- We have fine-tuned our National Guidelines and Procedure in Processing our Eagle Scout Candidates - with emphasis on quality learning experiences.

M.I.S. UPDATES ON BSP CAMP SITES

As of January 8, 2013, a total of 8,005 registered online CAMP participants are currently taking the online module, while a total 1,824 Teachers and Adult Leaders have successfully completed the said program. This figure covers the CAMP Sites Program from Central Luzon, National Capital, Southern Tagalog, Eastern and Western Visavas, Eastern Mindanao Regions and other Non-BSP CAMP Site areas. The ultimate goal of this program: "To help Build a Nation of Readers".

MIS Report on APR-BSP MoP Project "Empowerment of Young people through Online Infrastructure

The Boy Scouts of the Philippines has secured a grant facility from the Messengers of Peace (MoP) Support Fund entitled Empowerment of Young People through Online Infrastructure through the help of the World Scout Bureau-Asia Pacific Region as one of the NSO Capacity Building Initiatives under the support fund categories.

9TH National Rover Moot

• With a total of twenty (20) school and local communities in the Municipality of Calaca, Batangas, the 2,327 Rover Scouts successfully completed and turned-over 25 Community Development Projects to the LGU. These are wall and fence reconstruction and painting, class room repair, tree planting, school-garden beautification, library repair, and masonry and carpentry related works at different public facilities.

- For 3 consecutive years we continued our support and campaign Against Dengue. BSP never failed to contribute in the betterment of health in our society.
- We have fully adapted and supported the WOSM's program thrust and campaign for "Messengers of Peace" which aims to inspire millions of young men and women throughout the world to work for the cause of Scouting: Creating a Better World! The initiative promotes young men and women as Leaders for Life – in their communities and in their world.

CAPACITY BUILDING AMONG ADULTS IN SCOUTING TO BETTER SERVE YOUNG PEOPLE IN SCOUTING-

- We conducted massive nationwide Risk and Safety Management Seminar-Workshops in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao in line with the APR Guideline on Risk Management Policy towards "Keeping Scouts Safe from Harm" and "Child Protection Policy". We are now on the final phase of writing our Risk Management and Child Protection Policy Handbook.
- We trained Leaders to become competent Instructors after successfully completing their Emergency Service Instructor's Training Course, which also supports our thrust on Safety and Risk Management in Scouting.

TO HELP CONTRIBUTE IN NATION BUILDING

- On the BSP Reach Out Project, we directed our Scouts to link and tie-up with various agencies to assist and help the victims of disasters by going out to evacuation and relief operation centers to extend any assistance. We also helped in the clean-up operations in the schools and community centers.
- We called and conducted another Massive Tree Planting Campaign under the Green is Go! Go for the Real Thing Project with Coca-Cola Export with a total target of more than 1 Million Trees by 2016.

CREATING POSITIVE IMAGE

- We published the "Good Morning" coffee-table book commemorating the 75th Charter Anniversary.
- And have hosted the APR Seminar Workshop for Correspondence to equip our Scouts and Leaders on ho to write and tell inspiring stories to further promote our cause of educating young people.

CORPORATE ASSETS MANAGEMENT

BSP Manila Property

- Since January of 2012, the 4th and 5th floors of the BSP National Office Building is now utilized as our National Office. The NSS moved its warehouse to the 3rd floor of the new building. The construction of ground floor space appropriated for the showroom of the NSS is still on going.
- The 1st and 15th floors are set to be completed by the 2nd quarter of 2013. Empire East Landholdhings Incorporated/Megaworld Corporation and BSP will jointly conduct the final inspection as part of the turnover activities.
- Sun Trust Development Corporation leases 141 square meters of space for their marketing operations.
- The National Executive Board (NEB) approved the lease of the 6th to 15th floors to Palm Residence Inn who shall operate the new BSP Hotel and will have the following features: (1) 6th Floor- the hotel reception lobby and restaurant; (2) 7th - 14th Floor - hotel rooms; and (3) 15th Floor - function rooms.
- Palm Residence Inn had its soft opening last June 2012. Rooms located at the 7th to 10th Floors are now ready for occupancy.

BSP Makati Property

- Alphaland Corporation, the BSP's partner in the development of the Makati Property will construct a multi-tower complex with a total construction floor area of 171,000 square meters. In the agreement, the BSP will have 15% across the board share on its total development.
- Through this project, the BSP and Alphaland Corporation commits to the promotion of sustainability by pursuing LEED green building certification.
 - Green buildings uses resources more efficiently compared to projects merely built to code. Green buildings provide healthier and safer working, living and play environments.
- The project is set to be completed by 2014. However, the podium shall be complete by March 2013.

BSP Baquio Property

New contracts of lease were issued to both new and existing tenants of BSP Baguio Property beginning March 2012.

BSP Makiling Hotel

The management contract for the BSP Makiling Hotel was awarded to El Cielito Hotels, Inc. last August 2012. El Cielito Hotels, Inc. commits to manage the BP International – Makiling Hotel for a period of ten (10) years. The hotel started its operation last October 2012.

OF TRADITION AND THE LIFE OF SCOUTS

His Excellency, the Vice President, WSB - RD, APR Mr. Abdullah Rasheed, the Secretary General, the National Executive Board, Regional Scout Directors, Council Scout Executives, Our distinguished honored friends, ladies and gentlemen.

Good morning!

Perhaps this greeting is not enough, I believe this occasion deserves more, a greeting for a Great Morning, appropriate for a great organization, a great group of leaders, trailblazing along the path of our great history.

Worry not however, I promise to make this short, just like a mini-skirt, it will be short enough to generate interest but sufficient to cover the bare essentials.

Allow me first to thank the National Executive Board for the invitation that has been extended to me. I am tasked to be a guest speaker, an honor for me, a young man who has nothing to himself except the responsibility of living honorable life, worthy of the award that was bestowed on me almost 15 years ago, that of an outstanding scout. At first I was apprehensive to accept this invitation, being in your presence will bring me back to the mind breaking and spirit shaking experience of a board of review or that of the final interview for TOBS. Nonetheless, I accepted, I am here, ready for the challenge and very much willing to live up to our motto: Laging Handa.

Ladies and Gentlemen, I am here today for one reason, TRADITION.

Just as an adlib, siguro yun din ang dahilan kung bakit yung mga magulang ko ay lumuwas ng Maynila para samahan ako papunta ng Makiling. Naging tradisyon na po ito sa aming pamilya, apat na lalaki, ako po ang panganay, lahat boy scouts. Wala pa po kaming camping dito na hindi sila pumunta. Sa totoo lang po, ang Camping lang na di nila ako nabisita ay yung 19th World Jamboree sa Chile subalit may magulang pa din po ako dun, yung atin pong Secretary General.

As I was saying, I am here because of tradition.

Tradition – is the passing of a behavior or a belief from one point in time up to an indefinite point. As time goes by, tradition evolves, it changes, but the essential value from the point such tradition existed will never perish. We may have different perspective of what Scouting is, but it will never change the essential meaning and value of what Scouting is all about.

What is this tradition you may ask? What is it that I am talking about?

Think of this, What is our heritage?

The BSP has promoted the ability of young men to do things for themselves and others, trained them in Scout craft, and taught them patriotism, courage, self-reliance. It is today one of the largest Scout organizations in the world, in terms of number of Scouts vis-à-vis the number of young people of Scouting age.

Our movement builds character and integrity. We foster volunteerism. We sustained generations of youth who are healthy and engaged. In the 75 years of Scouting in the country, and even more if we count those troops formed unofficially, just guided by Baden Powell's inspiring handbook, look at the impact it has made on our country, count our heroes, our athletes, leaders, revisit our rosters and see the countless or principled citizens that we (no, not we....but you have molded).

This is our heritage, and making it so is our continuing tradition. I believe that it is in the passing of something of value from one generation to the next is the true meaning of tradition; whether it's the spirit of mentoring or the spirit of service. This is what Scouting does. And this Ladies and gentlemen, is the tradition I refer.

You may know the Scout's tradition of "Do a Good Turn Daily." And we all know the story. In 1909, a Chicago publisher named William Boyce got lost in the London fog. A young boy helped him find his way but wouldn't take the shilling Boyce offered. He said Scouts don't take payment for "doing a good turn." Boyce, on the other hand, had never heard of Scouts, but he was so intrigue that he learned all about the British program, then came home and helped create the Boy Scouts of America - which was transplanted to our islands, from thence, Scouts have honored the memory of that day by doing "good turns."

We in the Association of Outstanding Scouts, have always remained faithful to this. Late last year, at around November, A Scoutmaster by the name of Guadalupe Jumao-as wrote a letter to the wife of my principal, the wife of my boss, seeking sponsorship of the registration of indigent Scouts from Lupang Pangako Elementary School. This is a school right at the foot of the Payatas Dumpsite in Quezon City. Unknown to her, the letter landed on the desk of an outstanding scout, and not just that, that TOBS, is the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Ten Scouting Boy Scouts of the Philippines Association, Inc.

We sought for her out, I even asked one of my staff to contact her and set-up a meeting with me. The funny thing was, we were very animated and very much spirited in discussing scouting matters, and the she asked why I know so much about Scouting. That is when I told her about me and the plans of TOBSPA.

Good turns poured in from all over the world. Our different batches of members seemed to have a contest on the number of scouts they can sponsor. Right now, we have 180 Scouts who did not only receive free registration, but free paraphernalia as well.

We had some criticisms online, a Scouter even pointed out that there are others who need help, Scouts from the provinces, also from indigent areas. "WHY MANILA?". Allow me therefore to apologize to all of you, we meant no favoritism, we just wanted to help.

But who are these kids you may ask, they are the "mangangalahig", the one's who go through the mountains of garbage to seek scrap, plastics, metals and yes, even food. They are the one's who despite the dangers to their lives because of their trade, have no insurance, have no network of protection. This is the reason that compelled, that lone Scoutmaster, Mrs. Jumao-as to seek help. According to her: "Kung magiging Boy Scout po sila, matuto sila, mayroon tayong skills na maaring ituro at higit sa lahat, yung limampung piso po na yun sa registration ay maroong insurance."

Her words of concern is an echo of the voices of our various leaders from the grass roots, let us not forget them for they are soldiers, valiant teachers, mentors, inspiring new generations and changing lives. Today we stand here to honor our leaders, vanguards of our tradition. We recognize their significant contribution to the Scouting Movement, to our heritage. This day, we hail those whose commitment ensured our continuance, always in the service of God and Country. I implore all of you, let us not forget who and what we are and the traditions that have set us apart from the rest. Our organization is an institution in itself, we educate, we train and we build future generations.

The other week when I was hanging out with a batch mate and his wife talking about children and future plans, I asked the wife: "what were your initial thoughts about me and your husband being boy scouts?' she said, I really want to poke fun at you guys for before, kasi naman diba para lang kayo mga grown up people in short pants wearing knee socks. Pero alam mo ok lang sa akin kung magiging boy scout din ang mga anak naming, because I know now that in Scouting and through Scout leaders you guys turned out just fine.

I asked "Good husbands?"

No, the best of husbands".....she said smiling, and not only that, the best brothers and friends to the women in their lives. I can't help it to be grateful to the Boy Scouts, knee socks and all." She chuckling and breaking out into a good laugh.

In behalf of those scouts who are now, great fathers, husbands, brothers and committed individuals, thank you very much to your esteemed honorees, it is my honor to stand and raise my and in a snappy salute in your honor.

Dear brothers and sisters in Scouting,

Today I am delighted to join you in this important gathering, your 57th Annual National Council Meeting. This event is very special to me personally as this would be the last time I am addressing this Council as the Regional Director of the Asia Pacific Region. My attendance here in recent years had given me a much bigger perspective of how a large National Scout Organization like the Boy Scouts of the Philippines operate in a consistent manner and it is always a pleasure to attend these gorgeous meeting and I have never missed any except just for one in the last eleven years.

I congratulate and thank you, the leaders of scouting in the Philippines for choosing the theme "Scouting" Education for Life". While we know in principle that education is the essential purpose of Scouting, it is always wise to come back and collectively affirm and to remind ourselves, again and again, that we are here for the education of young people and it is our commitment as leaders to carry them through the rest of their lives.

Even at the world level, Education remains as the core business of Scouting. Our organization has a very unique educational model, a method that served us well for over 100 years. This is important because it will point the way forward for the educational methods of Scouting. We hope to achieve this by bringing in expertise both from inside and outside of Scouting.

The organizers are expecting 200-300 participants on-site, and another 1,000 join-in participants online. This gathering will be helpful to National Youth Program Commissioners including Section Commissioners, National Training Commissioners, volunteers responsible for youth program and training, and other people that your organization feels can contribute to the event. For the time being, the three main threads are EDUCATION, LIFE and IMPACT OF SCOUTING ON EDUCATION AND LIFE.

For sure, Boy Scouts of the Philippines will not miss this opportunity. You have the capacity to share your expertise in this area, and it is also a good occasion to learn from the success of other Scout organizations and from other institutions outside of Scouting. I hope that there will be one participant from each Council and for the BSP to have the largest delegation in this important scouting Forum.

As I said earlier, this is my last address to this Annual Council Meeting, so let me take this opportunity to express my very sincere gratitude for the full cooperation that the Boy Scouts of the Philippines accorded me for the last eleven years. In those years, I had the pleasure of attending a number of events in different provinces and local councils. I personally thank the National President of BSP, Vice-President Jejomar Binay for his leadership and support, Secretary General J.R.
