SUBJECT : **10th NATIONAL ROVER MOOT**

1. We are pleased to announce the holding of the 10th National Rover Moot on 22-28 October 2013 at Aklan with the theme "Scouting: Education for Life"
2. Unique activities are lined-up for this six-day event focused mainly on leadership, community development, environment preservation and fellowship.
3. Objectives: The Rover Moot aims to:
 - instill and internalize the value of autonomy and a sense of social responsibility among Rover Scouts;
 - prepare Rover Scouts in performing services needed by barangay's and communities especially as regards environmental education and action to help save Mother Earth;
 - improve leadership skills and ability to work as a team; and
 - appreciate the cultural and historical heritage of the host city/province.
4. The following are the guidelines to determine the contingent requirements:
 - a. **Participation:** For Rovers and Roverettes 16-24 yrs of age, the participation quota per region are as follows:

Ilocos Region	100
Northeastern Luzon Region	100
Central Luzon Region	100
National Capital Region	200
Southern Tagalog Region	300
Bicol Region	100
Western Visayas Region	600
Eastern Visayas Region	300
Western Mindanao Region	100
Eastern Mindanao Region	300
TOTAL	2,200

Rover Peers are encouraged to join but not to exceed 10% of the total Council Contingent.

We also encourage the participation of Senior Scouts (4th year High School Students) for them to start their membership on Rovering and Service.

- b. **Registration:** A Registration fee of One Thousand Pesos Only (P 1,000.00) shall be charged each participant to cover expenses for program materials, certificates, individual souvenir items and payment must be made to the National Office through the Local Council on or before September 16, 2013.
 - c. **Equipment:** The standard Circle equipment is prescribed in activities of this nature. It is suggested that only handy equipment (tent, cooking gears, sleeping bags, food provisions, uniform, costumes, extra clothes, personal toilet kit. etc.) should be brought by every contingent.
 - d. **Food:** The delegates will cook their own food. All contingents are expected to have adequate food supply to last for the duration of the moot.
 - e. **Transportation:** Arrangement for transportation to and from the venue is the responsibility of every contingent.
