# SUBJECT : ASIA PACIFIC REGIONAL COURSE FOR LEADER TRAINERS

- In line with the new thrust of the National Training Commission and the Adults in Scouting Committee to give more learning opportunities and personal development training to all Adults in Scouting and further capacitate the ranks of our National Training Team, the Boy Scouts of the Philippines is pleased to announce its support to the Asia-Pacific Region to organize qualified Trainers to participate in the upcoming Asia-Pacific Regional Course for Leader Trainers (APR-CLT) on 26 October to 1 November 2015 at the Korea Scout Association (KSA) National Training Centre, 107-62 Seosamneung-gil, Deogyang-gu, Goyang-si, Gyeonggi-do, Korea 412-030.
- 2. This training course is an auxiliary event to the 25<sup>th</sup> Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Conference pursuant to the **APR Circular No. 19, series of 2014**. The course aims to train aspiring and potential Assistant Leader Trainers (ALTs) in their management and leadership roles and responsibilities and be able to help contribute in the development of Adult Leader Training in the BSP.
- 3. Interested participants must have an **"active"** status in serving training courses at the council, region and or at the national level; duly recognized as full-pledge **Assistant Leader Trainer (holding three beads)** for at least 2 years; currently registered at the Local Council; be able to communicate well in both spoken and written English; must have a recommendation from the Local Council and or the Regional Office; and be willing to commit to serve in future training courses of the BSP after attending the CLT.
- 4. The **Course Registration Fee is \$150.00** USD per participant to cover course kit and materials, inland transportation, accommodation (check-in on 25 October and check-out on 2 November 2015), meals (from dinner on 25 October to breakfast on 2 November 2015), educational tour and course documents.
- 5. Course Fee and other related expenses that maybe incurred in connection with this training course is chargeable against MOOE and other appropriate local funds subject to its availability and the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 6. The course registration shall be on **"first-come and first-serve"** basis due to limited number of slots for all NSOs/NSAs in the Asia-Pacific Region.
- Endorsement from the Local level shall reach the National Office, BSP c/o PARD-FOD on or before **30 June 2015** together with duly accomplished **2015 APR-CLT Reply Slip** herewith attached for your easy reference.
- 8. Participants shall be responsible for their own airfare ticket arrangement and documentation requirements to obtain their Korean Visa after the confirmation of participation from the National Office, BSP.
- 9. National Office, BSP reserves the right to approved/disapproved official endorsement of any interested applicants based on existing policies and applicable rules and regulations.


