SUBJECT: COMMEMORATIVE NECKERCHIEF AND PATCH FOR THE 100 YEARS

CELEBRATION OF THE INTRODUCTION OF THE SCOUTING PROGRAM IN

THE PHILIPPINES

- 1. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines has launched the 100 Years Celebration of the Introduction of the Scouting Program in the Philippines, pursuant to the decision of the National Executive Board to celebrate the introduction of the Scouting program in the Philippines.
- 2. The Scouting program was introduced and brought in the country in 1914 and resulted in the formation of an all-Muslim Filipino troop of 26 Scouts in Zamboanga City by Lt. Sherman L. Kiser known as the Lorillard Spencer Troop.
- 3. The Centennial Neckerchief and Patch are now available at the National Scout Shop at **ONE HUNDRED SIXTY PESOS (P160.00)** and **SIXTY PESOS (P60.00)** respectively. The design and the description of the Centennial Logo is herein attached for reference.
- 4. In order to monitor and to regulate the production and release of the commemorative items for bulk orders, an Order Form must be processed and duly approved by the National Office, a copy of which is hereto attached. Any office, Local Council and/or group or organization who wish to avail of the said commemorative items must accomplish the order form.
- 5. The Centennial Neckerchief will be used as the special neckerchief in all of the activities of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines from July 2014 until November 2015 except for National Court of Honors and Trainings for Scouts and Adult Leaders at all levels.
- 6. The Centennial Patch must be placed at the center of the left sleeve of the Type "A" Uniform, consistent with existing policies for Scout Uniforms and Insignia.

# The Official Logo of the Centennial Celebration

The coat of arms for the Philippine Scouting Centennial bear three controlling elements:

### Fleur-de-lis (trefoil)

The fleur is the general symbol of the Scout Movement, embodied in the World Scout Emblem. Each of the plum signify the three-fold duties of a Scout – duty to others, duty to God and country, and duty to self.

#### Vinta

The vinta depicts the origin of the Scouting Program in the country, Zamboanga City, the very place where the first Filipino Muslim troop was organized
