SUBJECT: SCOUT MEMBERSHIP GROWTH CAMPAIGN PROGRAM

The BSP Strategy Map: Vision 2025 outlines the strategic objectives and the necessary action steps that the Boy Scouts of the Philippines will be undertaking over the course of the next ten (10) years in order to achieve its Major Final Outcome –Membership Growth. Our overall aim is the continuous growth in our membership to more young people, targeting at least 3.7 Million Scouts by the year 2025 or an average growth of five percent (5%) annually.

With Membership Growth as the Major Final Outcome of the BSP, we see more young people to experience and benefit from the programs, projects and activities in the future as we aimed to help the most number of youth in the country to develop values and acquire competencies to become responsible citizens and capable leaders thereby contributing to create a better and progressive society.

The BSP recognizes the significant role of the Local Councils in the overall Scout Membership Campaign as they are in the frontline of delivering the Scouting Program to more young people within their respective jurisdictions as clearly highlighted under the Strategic Priority on Organizational Excellence.

In this connection, the Scout Membership Campaign Incentive Program is designed to help achieve the expected growth of membership performance in the next six (6) years and at the same time giving financial incentive to the Local Council Frontliners in order to motivate them to deliver better performance in their Scout membership campaign program with the end view of achieving the goal of registering 3.7 Million Scouts by 2025. Specifically, the program is aimed to:

- 1. Attain the 2019 Scout membership goal of the 120 Local Councils of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.
- 2. Contribute to the attainment of the membership target as set in the Performance Evaluation Scorecard of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.
- 3. Provide incentives to performing Local Council professionals/personnel who have significantly contributed in the attainment of the MFO on Membership Growth.

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METHODOLOGY


Project Officer. In order to meet the National Scout Membership Goal, one (1) **Project Officer (PO)** will be engaged from each of the 120 Local Councils of the BSP who shall be primarily responsible in achieving the respective Local Council Membership Goals. For this purpose, Council Scout Executives/ Officers-in-Charge (CSEs/OICs) shall serve as Project Officer or other duly authorized Local Council personnel to be endorsed by the Local Council Executive Board.

Assistant Project Officers. Recognizing that larger Local Councils will entail additional manpower requirement in order to meet their respective Membership Goals or maintain/exceed their previous actual membership performance, Assistant Program Officers (APOs) may be engaged by the National Office based on its 2019 Membership Goal or its 2018 Actual Membership Performance, whichever is higher, according to the following threshold:

Local Councils may assign its existing Field Scout Executives (FSEs), Assistant Council Scout Executives (ACSEs), or Council Staff as Assistant Project Officers upon endorsement/recommendation from the Local Council Executive Board.

Honoraria. In recognition of their services, Project Officers and Assistant Project Officers shall be entitled to an Honoraria amounting to **Fifty Thousand Pesos** (**P50,000.00**) and **Thirty Thousand Pesos** (**P30,000.00**), respectively, for the period March to December 2019. The Honoraria shall be released in tranches and upon the attainment of the following deliverables and the submission of required documents indicated in the timetable below:

Payment of the honoraria shall be strictly based on the attainment of the above-mentioned deliverables/milestones. Succeeding tranches shall not be released unless the specified milestone and shall be forfeited in favor of the BSP by yearend.

Replacement of Project Officers and Assistant Project Officerss. In the event of retirement, resignation, and/or other modes of separation of the initially idetified Project Officers and Assistant Project Officers, the Local Council may designate their replacements through a Board Resolution. However, the replacement Project Officer and/or Assistant Project Office shall only be entitled to the

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remaining tranches of the honoraria for the year and upon reaching the program deliverables/milestones.

Recalibrated Scout Membership Potential. In order to ensure that the project is anchored on accurate and standard data and information, the Scout Membership Potentials of the 120 Local Councils is hereby recalibrated as eighty-five percent (85%) of the actual boy population of Scouting age base on 2015 Census of Population and Housing conducted by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).

For purposes of standardizing the basis of the total Scout Membership Potential of the BSP, the actual population figures within the range of 5-19 years old were used as this also provides a picture of the general Scouting population for which the Scouting program is intended pursuant to Commonwealth Act No. 111, as amended by Republic Act No. 7278.

The Membership Potential may be further recalibrated based on the succeeding census to be conducted by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).

Revised Membership Goals. With the recalibration of the Membership Potential, the Membership Goals are hereby revised to reflect the equal contribution of all Local Councils to the MFO regardless of their Scout Membership Potential. For this purpose, a uniform Scout Membership Goal factor shall be applied to all the 120 Local Councils to be derived using the following formula:

 $\frac{\textit{National Membership Goal}}{\textit{Total Membership Potential}} = \textit{Annual Membership Goal Factor}$
