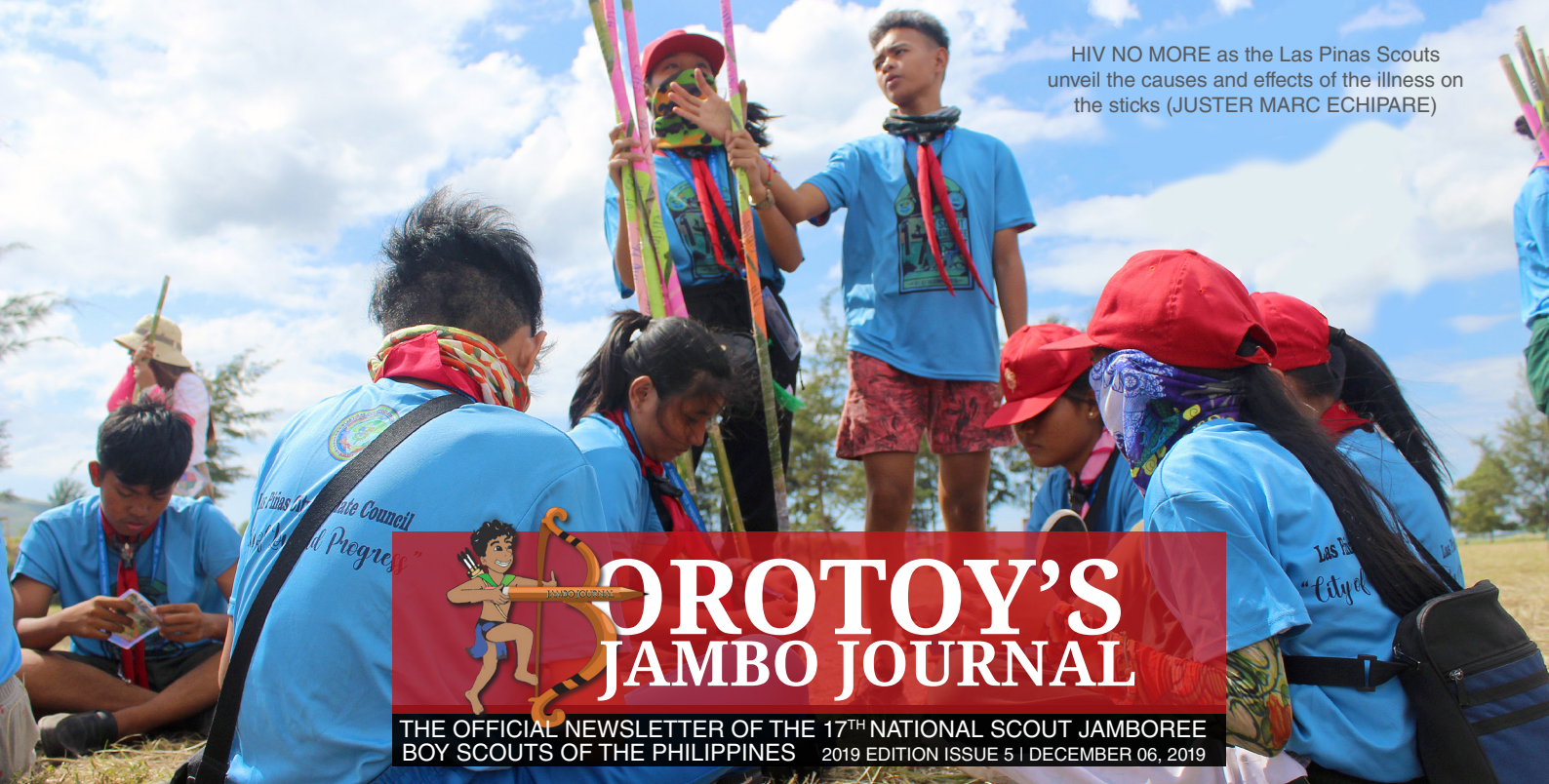

These were the exact words of Juana F. Lampaya of Bulacan Council, Team Leader of the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Pick-up Sticks as they gave awareness to the 17th National Jamboree Scouts yesterday at Camp Kainomayan Botolan, Zambales.

of the Philippines we should use social media as a vital tool to inform others. By being good models to everyone, we can save lives.

“Prevention is better than cure because once it enters your body, you have nothing to but regret,” Ricardo added explaining his certainty to his fellow Scouts.

Explaining the causes and effects of the illness indicated on the sticks, the activity ended with a group explanation of their roles to stop HIV.
