REGISTRATION AND ARRIVALS

The 63rd Annual National Council Meeting of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines was conducted on 29-31 May 2019 at the Capitol Convention Center, Provincial Capitol Complex, Pili, Camarines Sur, which was hosted by Camarines Sur Council.

The conference delegates, observers and staff started to arrive in the city on 28 May and were billeted at the CamSur Watersports Complex Hotel and other nearby hotels in Pili and Naga City. Registration started on the afternoon of 28 May until the morning of 29 May.

DAY 1 WEDNESDAY – 29 May 2019

MEETING OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD

The National Executive Board (NEB) held its meeting at the Provincial Capitol Complex of Camarines Sur on the morning of 29 May 2019 which was hosted by the Chairperson of BSP Camarines Sur Council, Governor Migz Villafuerte. The meeting focused on matters and concerns pertinent to the conduct of the 63rd Annual National Council Meeting (ANCM). *(A separate proceeding of the said meeting forms part of the Minutes of the Meetings of the NEB).*

CONFERENCE ORIENTATION

The Conference Orientation was done by RSD Ramil S. Borbon who extended his greetings and salutations to all the delegates and guests of the 63rd ANCM. The highlights of his conference orientation are as follows:

- a. **Conference Kit** – Upon registration, delegates are handed a conference kit that includes the proceedings of last year conference, the conference program, the election brochure, Meal Ticket, ID, Lace, Memo and a pen.
- b. **Conference Souvenirs** – Souvenir items for the 63rd ANCM are bag and conference patch.

Only those who confirmed their attendance and are present during the conference shall receive the Conference Kit and Conference Souvenir.
- c. **Proceedings for the 63rd ANCM** – the delegates were advised to go over the said document, and are advised to present their comments and suggestions during the adoption of the said document on the first plenary session.
- d. **BSP Annual Report** – each delegate will get one copy of the 2018 BSP Annual Report.
- e. **2018 Financial Statements** – copies of the 2018 Financial Report forms part of the BSP Annual Report.
- f. **Shuttle services** will be provided by the host with the following arrangement:
 - Pick up point for Robertson and Villa Caceres Hotel is at Villa Caceres.
 - Naga Pilgrimage Hotel and Lemon Residences is at Lemon Residences.
 - Crown Hotel, Star View Hotel, and Plaza Quezon is at Plaza Quezon.
 - Eurotel and Naga Regent Hotel is at Eurotel.
 - Other pick up points are: CVD Hotel, Villa Rosita and Flamingo Hotel.
 - The schedule of pick up is 6:30 to 7:45 in the morning.
 - There will be available shuttles outside the venue after dinner to shuttle the delegates to their respective hotels.
 - On the last day, a shuttle will also be provided to shuttle participants from the hotel to the airport. Make sure to arrange your request to the Transportation Committee a day before your flight schedule.



- g. **Meal Schedule** – Morning Snacks will be served at 10 in the morning, Lunch at 12 noon, Afternoon Snacks at 3 in the afternoon, and Dinner at 6 o'clock in the evening. They were advised to present their meal ticket during mealtime.
- h. **NO Smoking** – A No Smoking Policy in all of the convention facilities will be strictly implemented throughout the duration of the conference. A penalty will be imposed for violators.
- i. **Tour Package** – is available for those who are interested to avail and tour the province and around Bicol Region. Interested participants were advised to proceed to Tourism Booth for assistance.
- j. **Transportation** – Car passes are given to participants for identification purpose including those who are staying outside the venue.
 - A regular fare of Php8 per head for tricycle with a maximum of 5 passengers if you are traveling within the Naga City Business District. From Naga to 711 Pili, Php50 per head will be charged. Then, from 711 Pili to Convention Center, take Haba-Habal and pay Php10 per head for a maximum of two passengers.
 - If you are travelling from SM Naga, you may take a bus at the Central Bus Station going to Iriga or Partido Anes for only PhP10. You may also ride a jeepney beside SM Naga (Naga-Pili Route) for Php14 per head and get off at 711 Pili corner Capitol Site. Then, take Habal-Habal for Php10 maximum of 2 passengers per trip.
- k. **Hotel Rules**
 - The hotel will not be liable for the loss of any personal equipment or belongings. Do not leave valuable items unattended.
 - Displaying of any laundry clothes or towel in the veranda and windows is strictly prohibited.
 - Illegal activities such as use or possession of prohibited drugs, gambling and prostitution are strictly prohibited.
 - No smoking inside the room
 - No pets are allowed in the hotel premises. No plants are allowed in the room.
 - Do not open your door to strangers. Peep through the door before opening.
 - Use of Recreational Facilities is on first come, first served basis.
 - Please do not take away the guest room items as souvenirs. Otherwise, charges will be added into your hotel bill.
 - The property is Government-owned and its privileges are discretionary with the management. We ask that room be occupied by the person renting the room are responsible for any damage to the room and its facilities.
 - In accordance to government regulations, all guests arriving and departing must register at the hotel's Front Desk and present a valid identification card
CHECK IN TIME: 2:00 P.M. CHECK OUT TIME: 12:00 NN
 - Early check in and late check in will be accommodated based on the room availability. Please advise the Front Desk accordingly. Should the guest wishes to extend beyond 12:00 NN, additional fee will be charge to his/her bill.
 - Guest must return Hotel Keys at Front Desk. Lost keys will be charge.

RECOGNITION AND PRESENTATION OF DELEGATES

As scheduled, the delegates started to assemble at the conference hall at around 1300H, in time for the pre-conference activities. RSD Pangilinan greeted all the delegates and requested them to sing with him a Happy Birthday song for the National President, Atty. Wendel E. Avisado who is celebrating his 66th birthday in time for the Opening of the 63rd Annual National Council Meeting. Immediately he made a Roll Call of the conference delegates according to their Scouting Region. A total of **NINE HUNDRED EIGHTEEN (918)** delegates registered for the 63rd ANCM coming from ninety-nine (99) Local Councils and ten (10) Scouting Regions of the Boy Scouts of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines. RSD Pangilinan then acknowledged the presence of the National Executive Board Members, DepEd Directors, Regional Scout Committee of Bicol Region, Council Chairmen, Local Council Commissioner, Council Scout Executives, Leader Trainers, Dr. Cecille Bernadette Rivera, hosts Schools Division Superintendent and to all Schools Division Superintendents, Hon. Al Francis Bichara, the Council Chairman, Hon. Cong. Luis Raymund F. Villafuerte, Jr. and the Host Council, Camarines Sur Council.

OPENING CEREMONIES

The Opening Ceremonies of the 63rd Annual National Council Meeting commenced at exactly 1400H with SG Rogelio S. Villa, Jr. as the Master of Ceremonies. The Ceremony started with the entry of BSP Key Officials, Guest of Honor and the Senior Scouts from Camarines Sur Council as flag bearers. The invocation was given by Rev. Fr. Alfonso L. Grageda. The singing of the Philippine National Anthem was led by DepEd Camarines Sur Choir, then the Panunumpa ng Katapatan sa Watawat ng Pilipinas led by Scout Elaine Dominique J. Celetaria and the Panunumpa at Batas ng Scout by Scout Julsen Pontanares, while the BSP Vision and Mission was led by Scout Dave Florenz Paul J. Santos, Regional Scout Representative of Mindanao.

In his Opening Remarks, BSP Senior Vice President Roberto M. Pagdanganan welcomed the participants and guests to the 63rd ANCM and thanked the host, BSP Camarines Sur Council, headed by Governor and Chairperson of Camarines Sur Council, Miguel Luis R. Villafuerte for making the event possible. He expressed his thanks and appreciation to all the Local Council Board members and officers for their continuous support to the leadership of the BSP as well as their promotion to the various program and projects of the BSP.

In his Welcome Remarks, DepEd Bicol Regional Director Dr. Gilbert Sadsad extended his warm greetings to the officers and organizers of the 63rd ANCM. Dr. Sadsad discussed about the importance of Scouting in the country and urged especially his colleagues in the Department of Education to work together and promote the Scouting program in the country. He said that the Boy Scouts of the Philippines has continue to devote through the years in promoting its primary objective which is to develop morally straight, discipline, concern and self-reliant citizens in the country.

This was followed by an Inspirational Message by the Secretary of Interior and Local Government Eduardo Año, who was represented by Director Emmanuel B. Felix. In his message, the head of the DILG, praised and congratulated the Boy Scouts of the Philippines in its 63rd Annual National Council Meeting. He encouraged all Local Government officials to actively support the program and activities of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines in their respective cities and provinces. He said that the country needs more boy scouts and Scout Leaders to make the Philippines a better and prosperous nation. Mr. Felix likewise bragged himself to be a proud product of Scouting that honed and developed through lessons on character, attitude, discipline, integrity and excellence that were instilled in him by the people behind the BSP. He said that he will always be grateful for the learnings, experiences, skills, and life lessons that made him into who and what he is today.

BSP National President, Atty. Wendel E. Avisado, announced to the delegates that he received a telephone call from Secretary Leonor Briones in response to the request for reconsideration of the travel and attendance of all DepEd officials and personnel to the 63rd ANCM. He said that the Secretary approved their travel for the said conference and their travel is now on Official Business. In his message, NP Avisado said that we should continue to keep our promise and rededicate ourselves in the selfless service to the Filipino youth by making sure that our programs, projects and activities appropriately respond to the needs of the present generation and ensure the sustainability of the Scouting movement in the country. He then formally declared the opening of the 63rd Annual National Council Meeting.

The National President then introduced Hon. Cesar B. Yano, Undersecretary for Defense Operations, Department of National Defense who represented the Chief Scout, President Rodrigo R. Duterte, as the Guest of Honor and Keynote Speaker.



USec Yano read the keynote address of His Excellency President Rodrigo Roa Duterte. In his keynote address, the Chief Scout congratulated the Boy Scouts of the Philippines in its 83 years in the service of the youth of the country. He said that the BSP has been a reliable partner in shaping the Filipino youth in becoming pro-active and law abiding citizens of the country. This organization founded by a group of patriotic Filipino men stood strong despite challenging time remaining steadfast in pursuing its goal and ideals which are inculcated in our Scouts love of God country and fellowmen, to prepare the youth to become responsible leaders in the near future. He continued that over the years, the Scouting movement has paid a significant role in transforming the lives of the young people to become capable leaders in the future.

The 1st Plenary Session was called to order at 1500H with Mayor Sofronio C. Ona, Jr, Vice President for Luzon, as Presiding Officer.

ADOPTION OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE PREVIOUS CONFERENCE

The Presiding Officer advised the delegates to go over and review the proceedings of the 62nd ANCM held in Surigao City last 06-08 May 2018.

NEBM Allan R. Rellon moved for the adoption of the proceedings of the 62nd Annual National Council Meeting which was duly seconded by NEBM Jose Ma. C. Gastardo. There being no objections, the proceedings of the 62nd Annual National Council Meeting was adopted.

Report of the National Treasurer

National Treasurer Jimmy A. Ang presented the highlights of the BSP's Financial Performance for CY 2018, as follows:

The financial statements are generally categorized under the key financial accounts, to wit:

- Assets;
- Liabilities;
- Fund Balance;
- Revenues;
- Expenses; and
- Excess of Revenues over Expenses.

The figures of Calendar Year 2018 are presented in comparison with the figures of Calendar Years 2017 and the various financial ratios for both Calendar Years are presented in parallel divergence with Calendar Year 2016 in order to gauge the extent on how we have performed for the period under review. Comparative results thereof are expressed in millions of pesos together with the corresponding changes in terms of percentages.

Generally, assets had slightly decreased by 3% which is attributed to the accounting revaluation of our Investment Property account and the derecognition of some Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE) items which are valued below Php15,000.00 in compliance with COA Circular 2015-007.

A closer look on the Current Ratio analysis reveals the following results on the basis of the mathematical relationship of the total current assets against the current liabilities; a ratio of 3.91 in 2018; 4.06 in 2017; and 3.95 in 2016. The said mathematical relationship explains our capability to pay our current financial obligations out of our current assets as they fall due.



Based on the foregoing data, the current ratios in 2018, 2017, and 2016 indicate that we have more than enough current assets to pay our current liabilities four times the requirement for the said operating periods. Apparently, we are a little bit more liquid in 2017 than in 2018 and 2016 though, as explained, this trend projects a very attractive financial picture in the eyes of our various stakeholders as it manifests our balanced and well-calculated liquidity management system.

He told them to be cautious, however, that the current ratio should not be too low, say 1.2 to 1, because we may find it difficult for ourselves to pay our current obligations when they mature. Neither should our current ratio be too high, for instance, 5 is to 1, for this means that an excessive investment in current assets does not produce or substantially yield much financial return for the organization.

Aggregate liabilities had decreased by almost Forty Nine Million Pesos (₱49M) or equivalent to a decline of Twenty Three (23%) owing to our religious fulfillment of our various mandated and contractual financial obligations. For this reason, the Debt Ratio analysis paints a continuing and substantial improvement as we posted a ratio of 0.032 in 2018; 0.04 in 2017; and 0.038 in 2016 which means that the percentage of our total assets provided by our creditors is continuously decreasing for the past three (3) years. We look forward that the same trend in our leverage financial ratios would continue in the coming years.

Cumulative Fund Balance stood up on almost the same level with a meager decrease of 2% which is attributed to the decrease in our revaluation surplus as well as to the cumulative changes in our fair value of the fund balance.

Aggregate Revenues posted a not-so noteworthy performance with a percentage decrease of 8% corresponding to almost Thirty Four Million Pesos (₱34M). Dissecting further our financial statements provides us an information that our business income which are mostly generated from the leasehold income from the various properties and facilities as well as from the sales revenues from the selling of scout shop items and paraphernalia through the National Scout Shop (NSS) have declined. The continued deterioration of the condition of the camps and facilities as well as the proliferation of fake scout shop merchandise in the market are the main culprits in the said dismal performance of our revenues. The National Executive Board (NEB) and the management are giving priority attention on how can we properly address and hurdle these challenges and conundrum in order to turn the tides in our favor in the next operating periods.

On a positive note, however, the aggregate expenditures had considerably decreased by Six Million Pesos (₱6M) because we have been very consistent in looking for cost-reduction and cost-effective measures in our day-to-day operations. We vow to do the same in the coming years in order to ensure the consistent implementation of a more prudent fiscal discipline.

Adopting the System of Operations of the Government

NT Ang stressed that the conversion of the BSP from its previous status to what it is now has not been that easy. The employees, and even most of the members of the National Executive Board (NEB), continue to struggle to learn the rope, so to speak. The truth of the matter is that, all of us are not that prepared and we are still acclimatizing ourselves, since the BSP was classified as a GOCC which placed our organization under the audit jurisdiction of the Commission on Audit (COA) seven (7) years ago, to the new system of operations specifically on our compliance with pertinent government accounting and auditing rules and regulations considering that we had been operating as a private organization for a long period of time with not much complexities in our business process. However, with patience and sense of dynamism to adopt to new business environment, we continue to improve our performance specifically on the aspect of transparency and accountability. More noticeable are the following measures or courses of actions which have been continuously improving, viz:

- Financial reporting system has tremendously improved as we are now compliant to the Philippine Public Sector Accounting Standards (PPSAS) as well as to the Philippine Financial Reporting Standards (PFRS) and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS). Even the usage of technical terminologies and jargons in our financial reporting system is now aligned with what is prescribed under the Government Accounting Manual (GAM), including the usage of various government forms and documents. The timeliness of our financial reporting has also vastly improved compared to our early years of operation as a Government Owned and Controlled Corporation (GOCC).
- Credit and collection policy has also immensely improved. We always make it a point that corresponding Statement of Account (SOA) is issued whenever a specific account is due or demandable on the basis of written contracts. Such measure further strengthens our system of controls as regards the proper accounting of our financial resources.



One of the earliest issues and concerns that was prioritized during the early years of shifting to government operational system is on the area of procurement wherein we immediately constituted a Bids and Awards Committee (BAC). Congruently, we established a corresponding Procurement Unit under the umbrella of Administration Division solely dedicated to take care of the procurement requirements of the BSP. Concerned personnel were sent to attend various pertinent seminars, trainings and workshops on the government procurement system in order to properly equip them with needed knowledge and skills in the government procurement process. Since then, all procurement requirements of the BSP have been processed in accordance with Republic Act 9184 or otherwise known as the Government Procurement Law.

- In terms of budgetary control, we have adopted the Responsibility Accounting System (RAS) wherein a stronger mechanism is in place which helps the management ensure that spending limits are adequate. This control is important because spending excesses have an unfavorable impact on the overall fiscal performance of the organization. The said system motivates further the management to perform in a manner consistent with overall organizational objectives. The assignment of responsibility implies that some revenues and costs can be changed through effective management. In essence, the said system strengthens budgetary control within the different operating units of the organization.

Few years ago, the BSP was subjected to the Global Support Assessment Tool (GSAT) audit by no less than the high-ranking officials of the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM). The purpose of which was to assess the compliance of a National Scout Organization (NSO) towards international best practices in Good Governance and Quality Scouting. The said Standard was developed in collaboration with [Société Générale de Surveillance](#) (SGS), the world's leading inspection, verification, testing and certification company with a well-proven track record in NGO audits. It is based on a consolidation of requirements that are specific to the Scout Movement, and on Best Management Good Governance Best Practices captured from the SGS NGO Benchmarking Standard. So far, the BSP got remarkable grades in most of the areas being audited, except for some which need further improvement. Indeed, the BSP is an NSO worth emulating for in the Asia-Pacific Region. In the years to come, however, we commit to hone our craft and continuously raise the bar by being an ISO-certified organization.

Report of the National President

The highlights of the report of the National President are as follows:

1. Membership

There were a total of **2,548,926 Scouts** registered in 2018 from the ten Scouting Regions of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines. Boy Scouting has the highest number of Scouts registered among the five sectional groups, which accounts 37.8% of the total Scout membership or equivalent to 963,265 Scouts. KAB Scouting follows next with 804,850 (31.6%), Senior Scouts – 502,540 (19.7%), KID Scouts – 218,426 (8.6%) and Rover Scouts- 32,622 (1.3%). Likewise, a total of 25,223 Scouts were registered under the Community-Based Scouting program for the year.

Scout membership for the year represents 94% accomplishment against the membership goal of 2.66M Scouts and a 25% achievement versus the membership potential of 9.87M Scouts.

Adults and Lay Leaders. A total of **166,204** Unit Leaders and Assistants from 86,054 Scouting Units who lend their support and services to the Scouting movement in 2018. The number of Unit Leaders and Assistants for 2018 is 7% higher than the previous year's total of 155,517. Unit Leader to Scout ratio improved to One Unit Leader for every Fifteen Scouts (1:15). Lay Leaders and other Volunteer Leaders, on the other hand, reached 51,667 or 5% higher compared to last year's figure of 49,411.

3. National Activities . The success of Scouting movement depends largely on the relevance and effectiveness of its program and activities in the pursuit of its purpose which is to contribute to the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials as citizen of their respective local, national and international communities. Major Scouting activities conducted in the year 2016 to support the goal, are as follows:

2018 National Scouting Month Kick-off Celebration and 82nd Charter Anniversary. October of every year is the celebration of Scouting Month, as declared under Presidential Proclamation No. 1326. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP) was founded on 31 October 1936 through Commonwealth of the Philippines Act 111. Since then, the BSP has been celebrating its anniversary annually in October which is called the Scouting Month.

The purpose of the celebration is to showcase to the public and the stakeholders, the contribution of the BSP to nation-building over the past eighty-two (82) years, through the development of the young people by actively engaging and supporting them to become agents of change in their respective communities.

This year's theme is "Growth and Stability". The highlights of the celebration were, Thanksgiving Mass, Opening Ceremony, Staff Fellowship and Fun Games with Scouts.

The celebration was attended by more than 200 Scouts and Unit Leaders from nearby councils of National Capital Region, NEB members, Guests and BSP staff.

Jamboree on the Air/Jamboree on the Internet (JOTA/JOTI) - The JOTA/JOTI is an annual event in which Scouts and Guides all over the world make contacts with each other by means of amateur radio, Short-wave radio signals carry their voices to virtually any corner of the world. It's the sheer excitement of



having a live conversation with a fellow Scout or Guide at some other place in the world that attracts so many youngsters to this event. JOTA is a real Jamboree during which Scouting experiences are exchanged and ideas are shared. The JOTA-JOTI is the only event offering to each individual Scout the experience that he or she really belongs to a worldwide Movement. The main JOTA and JOTI offer an excellent opportunity to meet Scouts, Guides and other from many countries throughout the World, exchange ideas, learn about other cultures and habits and make new friends. In other words, it is a great opportunity to really feel that you belong to a worldwide movement of 28 million members. Bring this opportunity to the attention of the Scouts and Leaders and encourage them to take part. More than TwoThousand Scouts from thirty (30) Local Councils participated the 61st Jamboree-On-The-Air (JOTA) and 22nd Jamboree-On-The-Internet (JOTI) which was held at the Philippine International Convention Center during the 6th APR Scout Conference.

100 Years of Rover Scouting (13th National Rover Moot). 2018 marks an important milestone in Scouting with the 100th year of Rover Scouting. The Rover section was introduced in 1918, eleven years after Scouting was founded by Robert Baden-Powell. The introduction allowed Scouting to expand to a wider range of age groups by incorporating young adults, those aged eighteen to twenty-six. To commemorate the 100 Years of Rover Scouting, the Boy Scouts of the Philippines conducted the 13th National Rover Moot on 26-31 August 2018 in three separate venues nationwide, Botolan Zambales in Luzon, Capitol Hills Scout Camp, Cebu City in Visayas and Pasonanca Park, Zamboanga City in Mindanao. More than 5,000 Rover Scouts and Leaders participated and contributed in the development of local communities through the immersion program, activities and service projects such as canal cleaning, construction and rehabilitation of Day Care Center, construction of toilet, house and school painting. Coastal cleanup, mangrove planting, production and distribution of garbage bin and other developmental projects.

4. Other Scouting Activities

Araw ng Kagitingan - The Boy Scouts of the Philippines has successfully joint celebrated with Philippines Veterans and the Department of National Defense the 2017 ARAW NG KAGITINGAN celebration with the objective of promoting, preserving and memorializing the principles, ideals and deeds of the Filipino veterans as a means to enhance patriotism and love of country, especially among the youth. Report of the Committee on Nominations

The report of the Committee on Nominations was delivered by its Chairperson, Governor Dale B. Corvera.

In order to appraise the delegates with the pertinent provisions of the National By Laws pertaining to the nominations for regular membership to the NEB, he cited Article V, Section 5 of the National By Laws which provides:

"Information on Nominees. He also asked local officials to help promote membership to the organization to participate in Scouting programs, projects, and activities such as jamborees, trainings, board meetings, and conferences and to allow BSP the free use of facilities for several scouting activities.

Moreover, the DILG 's directive urged local governments to sponsor and pay for the membership fees of public school children or grant financial assistance to their counter part Councils in furtherance of the Scouting movement. This move may be chargeable against their local funds subject to the availability of funds, or access SK Funds for the implementation of Barangay Scouting Program for the implementation of priority programs of the government such as anti-illegal drugs, anti-smoking, disaster risk reduction, and environment protection.

The DILG likewise directed each LGU's designated Scouting Coordinator for efficient coordination of Scouting concerns at all levels.
