SUBJECT: 2024 SEARCH FOR THE TEN OUTSTANDING BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES

 The Boy Scouts of the Philippines is pleased to announce the 2024 Search for the Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippine (TOBS), as approved by the National Executive Board to give due recognition to Scouts who best epitomize valuable qualities of community leadership, academic excellence and good moral character in which made a significant impact and great contribution in the Organization.

2. QUALIFICATIONS

The search is open candidates who should be:

- A registered Senior Scout and has not yet advanced to the Rover Scout Section
- 15-18 years old upon nomination
- At least a Venturer Scout
- Committed to the Scout Promise and Law and to the Laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
- a. For private/public school students:

A student with a general weighted average of at least 85% and no grade lower than 80% in all subjects taken for the last 2 years;

For Alternative Learning System (ALS) students

A passer of the ALS Accreditation and Equivalency (A&E) Assessment and Certification with a Passing Score of at least (60%).

3. STAGES OF THE PROCESS

1. National Call for Nomination

Any person or organization of known probity or of good standing can nominate any Senior Scout for the Search who meets the general qualifications and criteria. All nomination forms, accomplished by the nominator and jointly certified under oath by the Outfit Advisor, Institutional Head and parents, must be submitted to the National Office and will be assessed by the Initial Screening Committee. The nomination forms must be submitted on or before July 15, 2024 through email at tobs@scouts.gov.ph or send it through mail to:

The Qualified nominees will be endorsed by the National Office to the respective Local Councils for verification.

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2. Local Council Validation

Local Councils must conduct validation based on the given criteria prior to endorsement to their respective Regional Coordination Offices.

3. Regional Search

Regional Coordination Offices must conduct its Search based on the given criteria, and must choose winners based on the given criteria. Regional Search winners will be endorsed by the Regional Coordination Offices to the National Office.

4. National Search

The National Office will then conduct the National Search to determine the overall top ten (10) winners after a series of activities composed of skill test and interview among others.

4. CRITERIA

The Candidates will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

1. Interview (55 %)

- A. Knowledge and Communication Skills
 - Language Proficiency
 - Organization of Ideas
 - Level of relevant knowledge on Social Issues or Issues of National concern
- B. Character, Values, and Personality
 - Common Courtesy
 - Grooming and Hygiene
 - Smartness in wearing the Scout Uniform
 - Bearing and Demeanor
 - Exhibits the exemplary qualities and values of an outstanding Scout

C. Leadership Ability

- Choose three points of the Scout Law and how you lived up to them
- Narrates accounts of leadership in your institution and community
- How do you maintain a well-rounded character?

2. Application of Scouting Skills for Self-Reliance and Preparedness (30%)

- Actual evaluation of Scout skills as earned during Advancement such as Safety, First Aid, Firemanship, Life Saving, and Emergency Preparedness among others.
- Degree of preparedness exhibited in responding to a situation.

Institutional and Community Accomplishment as a Scout (15%)

- 3.1 Institutional Accomplishment
- Scholastic standing from first to current year in high school which consists of academic grades as certified by the School Principal/Director and Rank in class as certified by the same authority.
- Membership/Participation in institutional activities, i.e., involvement/participation to
 Institutional projects certified by the head of the organization/institution. A certificate
 of membership of the organization/institution involved with, and character
 recommendation certified by the head of the organization/institution.
- Other institutional leadership and activities spearheaded/participated in, which indicate
 the level of involvement, i.e., International/National/Regional/ Division/School.

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3.2 Community Accomplishment as a Scout

- Community-based leadership and activities spearheaded and participated in response to the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs').
- Participation and involvement in International, National, Regional, Council-wide, District-wide, and Institution scouting activities like Jamborees, Trainings, Program Seminars, and Skills Camp in should be evidenced by the photocopy of the activity certification as verified and certified true by the Institutional Head/Council Scout Executive/Regional Scout Director concerned should be presented.
- Community-based leadership and activities spearheaded/participated ie;

Position in community-based organization other than the BSP

 Community-based activities organized indicating the level (International/National/ Regional/Division/Community)

 Community-based activities participated indicating the level (International/National/Regional/Division/Community)

Scouting activities organized indicating the nature and level of activities

Awards, recognitions, and public testimonials related thereto;

 Church-based activities indicating the position in the church-based organization and involvement in the church-based activities certified by the Parish Priest/Pastors/Official based on the Scout faith denomination.

All the mandated members of the Regional Screening Committee are required to sign the evaluation report. Noncompliance shall automatically disqualify the nominee.

NATIONAL SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines (TOBS) Search Committee to be constituted by the National Executive Board.

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6. QUOTA PER REGION

As approved by the National Executive Board, each Scouting Region is entitled to one (1) representative in the national search and additional representative for every 150,000 Scouts registered in the Region. Hence, the quota per region based on Scout Membership as of 31 December 2023 is as follows:

All National Finalist (Regional Winners) will receive a Plaque of Recognition, TOBS Medal and a Cash Prize of Php 10,000.00. Certificates of Recognition will also be given to their respective Outfit Advisors, Sponsoring Institutions and Local Councils.

b. National Winners

All National Winners will receive a TOBS Trophy, Medal and a Cash Prize of Php 50,000.00. Plaques of Recognition will also be given to their respective Outfit Advisors, Sponsoring Institutions and Local Councils.
